Adult Reconstruction Fellowship Match Program Agreement

AGREEMENT

This agreement is made and entered into as of the _____ day of ______, 2021, by and between the **American Association of Hip and Knee Surgeons** (AAHKS), an Illinois not-for-profit corporation with its principal place of business at 9400 West Higgins Road – Suite 230, Rosemont, Illinois 60018-4976, **The Hip Society** (THS), an Illinois not-for-profit corporation with its principal place of business at 1515 East Woodfield Road, Suite 345, Schaumburg, IL 60173, **The Knee Society** (TKS), an Illinois not-for-profit corporation with its principal place of business at 1515 East Woodfield Road, Suite 345, Schaumburg, IL 60173, **The Knee Society** (TKS), an Illinois not-for-profit corporation with its principal place of business at 1515 East Woodfield Road, Suite 345, Schaumburg, IL 60173, (collectively "the Organizations"), and _______, M.D. (the "Program Director"), **Program Director** of the Adult Reconstruction Fellowship Program at _______ (the "Program").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Organizations work with the San Francisco Match (SFM) and its Specialty Matching Service to facilitate advanced clinical experience and fellowship placement services for orthopaedic surgeons with special interest in Adult Reconstruction (the "Match");

WHEREAS, the Program offers one or more fellowships and desires to participate in the Match to locate and accept applicants for such fellowships; and

WHEREAS, the Organizations and the Program Director desire to memorialize certain terms and conditions of the Program's participation in the Match to locate and accept applicants for the Program's fellowships.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- **<u>1.</u> <u>Definitions</u>**. The following terms shall have the meanings set forth below:
 - 1.1. "Applicant" shall mean a person seeking to obtain a position as a Fellow.
 - 1.2. *"Fellow"* shall mean a physician who participates for at least 12 months in a Clinical Fellowship Training Program for Adult Reconstruction which is participating in the AAHKS, THS, TKS Fellowship Match Program.
 - 1.3. *"Fellowship"* shall mean a Clinical Fellowship Training Program for Adult Reconstruction with a minimum Fellowship length of twelve (12) months.
 - 1.4. *"International Fellow"* shall mean a non-U.S. or non-Canadian citizen who obtained his or her residency training outside of the U.S. and Canada.
 - 1.5. "*Research Fellowship*" shall mean an Adult Reconstruction fellowship position focused primarily on performing research. Research fellowships will not be included in the match unless they included a clinical component meeting the definition in section 1.3.
 - 1.6. "Participating Program" shall mean an Adult Reconstruction fellowship program that is qualified as outlined in Section 1.3 and completed the Adult Reconstruction Match contract (the "Exhibit A") by Friday, July 30, 2021.

2. Conditions of Participation.

- 2.1. The Program shall enter into a binding Participation Agreement with the SFM and Applicants in substantially this completed form and the Exhibit A located online https://www.aahks.org/the-match/for-program-directors/program-agreement-form/.
- **<u>3.</u>** <u>Program Obligations</u>. As consideration for the Organizations' efforts to facilitate placement services for Applicants and Participating Programs, the Program shall adhere to the conditions set forth below:
 - 3.1. The Program shall honor its commitments to the SFM and Applicants under its signed Exhibit A.
 - 3.2. The Program shall not accept a fellow for its Fellowship who is not a participating Match Applicant. All Fellowship positions offered by the Program shall be filled through the SFM, with the following exceptions:
 - a. Any Fellowship position that is "unmatched" through the SFM;
 - b. A Fellowship position reserved only for International Fellows, provided the position is designated for International Fellows only by the 15th of August preceding the applicable "Match Day".
 - c. A Fellowship position reserved only for Research Fellows, provided the position is designated for Research Fellows only by the 15th of August preceding the applicable "Match Day."
 - 3.3. The Program shall not pressure Applicants to commit to a Fellowship prior to the Match.
 - 3.4. The Program shall not seek assurances from Applicants as to an Applicant's intent to "rank" a Program's Fellowship in a certain order and shall similarly not state or imply in any way that the Applicant's position on the Program's SFM Rank List is at all dependent upon the Applicant's relative level of interest in the Program's Fellowship. No verbal or written communication between the program and applicants is binding. There shall be no communication between the Program and the Applicants after the interview until the Match is made.
 - 3.5. The Program shall not withdraw any Fellowship positions from the Match at any time prior to "Match Day", nor offer any Applicant, irrespective of whether or not the Applicant has signed a Participation Agreement, any position as a Fellow prior to Match Day, except as provided in <u>Section 3.2(b)</u> hereof.
 - 3.6. The Program shall not interview any Applicant for a Fellowship position prior to executing its Exhibit A and agrees to interview candidates only during the approved months consistent with the Adult Reconstruction Match Program's Agreement, as noted below:
 - a. Interview Period: *October 2021 thru March 2022*.
 - 3.7. The Program shall pay the Organizations an administrative fee of \$500.00 to cover the administrative costs of coordinating the Match. Payment is due by **Friday**, **July 30**, **2021**. Programs that wish to join after the due date *may* be added at the discretion of the Organizations.
 - 3.8. The Program shall use a standard application provided by the SF Match but may request additional information from the Applicants not covered by the application.
- **<u>4.</u>** <u>**Organizations' Obligations**</u>. As consideration for the Program's participation in the Specialty Matching Service, the Organizations shall perform the following:
 - 4.1. The Organizations shall have a Fellowship Match Committee, whose membership shall consist of the following: at least eight (6) members one (1) representative and (1) alternate representative each from AAHKS, THS, and TKS and one (1) Chair. The Fellowship Match Committee shall be responsible for implementing the provisions of this Program Agreement as well as supervising and overseeing commitments agreed to under the Exhibit A.

- 4.2. The Organizations may make research and educational materials or grants available only to participating programs, which have executed the Exhibit A and the Program Agreement with the Organizations ("Participating Programs").
- 4.3. The Organizations shall publicize the names, contact information, and/or additional selected program information for all Participating Program Fellowships by such means as the Organizations' websites, advertisements or articles by the Organizations in orthopaedic journals, and/or information released by the Organizations to other orthopaedic organizations, orthopaedic residents, orthopaedic residency program directors, and/or other faculty involved in resident education. The Organizations shall not publicize the above-listed information for fellowship positions offered by programs that have not executed the Exhibit A and Program Agreement with the Organizations.
- 4.4. The Organizations shall survey Applicants and Programs after the Match has taken place to gather Match Data and to gauge if any Program violated its Program Agreement and/or Exhibit A, and if so, to obtain further information as to the specifics of any alleged breach.
- 4.5. The Organizations may give preference to faculty from Participating Programs over faculty from nonparticipating programs with respect to awarding research grants and participating as a Symposium faculty member, an Educational Course faculty member, a Committee Member or Chair for the Organizations' Committees, and/or for service on the Organizations' Boards of Directors.
- 5. Events of Default. Should the Program fail to honor its commitments under its Program Agreement and Exhibit A or otherwise breach this Program Agreement or its Exhibit A as determined by a majority vote of the Organizations' Fellowship Match Committee (a "Defaulting Program"), the Defaulting Program agrees the Fellowship Match Committee may impose any/all of the following restrictions upon its future participation in the SFM for qualifying Fellowships:
 - 5.1. A Defaulting Program may be ineligible to participate as a Participating Program in the Match for up to two (2) years following the term of its breach.
 - 5.2. A Defaulting Program acknowledges and agrees that only **after** satisfaction of the requirements and conditions in this <u>Article 5</u> shall a Defaulting Program be eligible to again participate in the SFM Specialty Matching Service for Fellowships.
 - 5.3. A Defaulting Program disagreeing with the Fellowship Match Committee's determination that the Program failed to honor its commitments under its Program Agreement and Exhibit A or otherwise breached this Program Agreement or its Exhibit A, the Defaulting Program may appeal the determination to the Organizations' Boards of Directors. Reversal or modification of a determination of the Fellowship Match Committee may be made by the Boards of Directors upon a majority vote of three (3) of the four (4) organizations.
 - 5.4. The Organizations shall report a Defaulting Program's breach of the terms of this Program Agreement or its Exhibit A to the SFM.
- **<u>6.</u>** Incentives. The Program Director agrees and understands that Programs participating in the Match, and do not Default under Article V hereof, may receive the following incentives from the Organizations:
 - 6.1. Priority for research grants from the Organizations, for both the Program Director and associated fellowship faculty.
 - 6.2. Priority for participation as faculty at the Organizations' Annual Meetings and other Educational Activities, for both the Program Director and associated fellowship faculty.

- 6.3. Priority for participation as an Organizations' Committee Member or Chair, for both the Program Director and associated fellowship faculty.
- 6.4. Recognition as an AAHKS Fellowship Program.
- <u>7. Penalties.</u> Participating programs and their faculty agree and understand that failure to comply or default under <u>Article V</u> as determined by a majority of the Fellowship Match Committee may have any or all of the following penalties imposed for a period time not to exceed two (2) years:
 - 7.1. Ineligibility to present scientific papers or posters at the Organizations' annual meetings.
 - 7.2. Ineligibility to participate as faculty for educational activities hosted by the Organizations.
 - 7.3. Ineligibility to join the Organizations' committees and/or board.
 - 7.4. Ineligibility to receive research or educational grants from the Organizations.
- **8.** Compliance with Applicable Laws and Regulations. The Program agrees that it shall comply with applicable federal, state, and local laws in executing its responsibilities under this Program Agreement and associated Exhibit A.
- <u>9.</u> <u>Term</u>. This Program Agreement shall be effective as of July 1, 2021 and shall continue in full force and effect until June 30, 2022. The agreement shall automatically renew annually, unless termination notice is given by the Program or by the Organizations thirty (30) days prior to expiration.
- <u>10.</u> <u>Termination</u>. The Organizations may terminate this Program Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice if the Program breaches or is in default of any obligation hereunder and said breach or default has not been remedied within fifteen (15) days after receipt of notice of such default or breach. Notwithstanding the above, the provisions of <u>Article 5</u> concerning Defaulting Programs shall survive the termination of this Program Agreement.
- **<u>11.</u>** <u>Notice</u>. All notices, requests, demands, and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be duly given to any party, (a) upon delivery to the address of such party specified below if delivered in person or by courier; (b) delivery into the United States Mail by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid; or (c) upon dispatch if transmitted by telecopy or other means of facsimile, to the following addresses or telecopy numbers as the case may be.

The parties may change the foregoing addresses and facsimile numbers through written notice to the other party as provided herein.

12. <u>Waiver</u>. A party may waive its rights under this Program Agreement only in writing. Any waiver by either party of its rights under this Program Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any other rights hereunder.

- **<u>13.</u>** <u>Assignment</u>. The rights and obligations arising under this Program Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the express written consent of the other party.
- **14. Severability**. Whenever possible, each provision of this Program Agreement shall be interpreted in such manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law. If any provision of this Program Agreement is held to be prohibited by or invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of such provision or the remaining provisions of this Program Agreement.
- **15.** <u>Complete Agreement</u>. This Program Agreement sets forth all the understandings of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, supersedes any prior, oral or written understandings and may not be altered, modified, or amended except by written instruments signed by both parties.
- **16. Governing Law**. This Program Agreement shall be construed and enforced under the laws of the State of Illinois.
